The Hamilton County, Ohio history, in an article written by a grandson of Jonathan, reads as follows - "Jonathan Mundell was one of the original settlers of the county; he came from Virginia to Ohio before the day of log school houses were erected, it being necessary then, for the young philomatheans to assemble in squads at some convenient place, and by mutual consent teach one another. Mr. Mundell was a gunsmith, and a man of some genius, and one who could render service to his fellows in the early pioneer days. He settled with his family, consisting of himself, wife and five children, near Mt. Washington, (Ohio) about the year of 1795. Some pear trees planted by him soon after his arrival are still standing."

He married **Mary McMahan** 1815 in Hamilton Co, OH, daughter of Francis McMahan and Mary. She was born 25 April 1797 in Columbia Twp, Hamilton, OH, and died 27 January 1874 in Clermont Co, OH.

The following biographical sketch is taken from the *History of Hamilton County, Ohio* by Ford, page 416a.

"James Mundell was the son of Jonathan Mundell. He was born in 1789 in Pennsylvania, he moved to Ohio with his parents when about two years of age. He was reared as a farmer, possessed no educational advantages, his time being taken up tilling the land and warding off hostile Indians, who were sometimes troublesome. In 1812 James served in the war, and received an honorable discharge from the service when the war ended. In 1815 he was married to Miss Mary McMahan, daughter of Francis and Mary McMahan, pioneer settlers of Columbus Twp. The old log house, her birthplace, which was then occupied by her parents, is still standing, weatherboarded now, as a relic and tenement of the early days of Columbia (Ohio). Mrs. Mundell was the mother of eleven children, eight boys and three girls, ten of whom lived to man and womanhood."
